## **Views and Experiences Exchange between Bangladesh and Indonesia on the Role of Religious Leaders in Family Planning Program**

# Introduction

## Background

The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) are agenda for reducing poverty and improving lives of the people agreed on at the Millennium Summit in September 2000. Among the eight goals, reducing child mortality and improving maternal health are two agenda that need special attention.

In achieving the goals, there is a need for support for the international and national processes. The Millennium Goals needs support from various groups so that it will be achieved as targeted. Its campaign has the aim to increase public awareness of the MDGs and public pressure on governments to deliver on their commitments. In this relation, the active involvement of the community and the community leaders, especially of the Moslem leaders, in this issue may have impact on the processes. As social leaders and institutions, Moslem leaders and faith based organizations should contribute to the improvement of the life of their community. In this relation, commitment and pressure of Moslem leaders as well as program activities of faith based organization is one of the action needed.

Indonesia and Bangladesh have the same opinion that the role of Moslem leaders in addressing restrictive religious and social norms and promoting behavior change are very important. Moslem leaders should find ways to solve population, reproductive health and family planning (PRHFP) issues in their respective country. Therefore, there is a need for continuous efforts to encourage and involve the Moslem leaders in creating a more favorable climate for program implementation.

Involving the Moslem leaders in the program may delegate them as the agents of change themselves, helping to minimize opposition while advancing policy and program goals. The involvement of the Moslem leaders will be more effective when undertaken through their own value and organization system where they can work together, share lessons and skills learned and with their resources.

The Ministry of Religious Affairs of Bangladesh wish to share experience from Indonesia on how to strengthen the role of Moslem leaders and faith based organization in family planning and reproductive health program. The UNFPA Indonesia as requested by the UNFPA Bangladesh has called the National Family Planning Coordinating Board (BKKBN) of Indonesia to facilitate this study tour and organize the meeting with various stakeholders of family planning program in Indonesia.

## Objective

The objective of the study tour is to share views and experiences of Indonesian Government in strengthening the role of Moslem leaders and faith based organizations in family planning and reproductive health program. The specific objectives are:

- To share views and experiences of the Indonesian Government efforts to strengthen the participation of Moslem Leaders and faith based organizations in family planning and reproductive health program.
- To share views of the Indonesian Moslem Leaders in RH/FP program
- To observe the activities conducted by faith based organization in RH/FP program

## **Expected Output**

The expected output of this study tour is to share the Indonesian experience on the following issues:

1. Family Planning and Reproductive Health issues, policy and program
2. The role of Moslem leaders and faith based organizations in family planning and reproductive health program
3. Advocacy and communication strategy to increase the participation of Moslem leader and faith based organization in family planning and reproductive health program
4. Programs and activities conducted by the Moslem leaders and faith based organizations in family planning and reproductive health program.

## **Duration of the Study Tour**

The study tour has been conducted on 9 to 16 August 2009

# Implementation

The study tour was attended by 7 participants from Ministry of Religious Affairs and Moslem Faith Based Organization (**see. Attachment-1, list of participant**) and it has been implemented as a planned (**see attachment-2, schedule of OST**). During the implementation, participants had a chance to discuss on the issues with the high level of Government Official, the prominent Indonesian Moslem Leaders, the chair of the Moslem Faith Based Organization (Muhamadiyah and Nahdatul Ulama), and the chair of the Indonesia Council of Ulama.

In each discussion and field visit, participants met with several representatives of respective stakeholders/institutions so they had gathered very rich and variety information from the first hand. The description below summarized several key issues that have been discussed during the OST.

## **The class session including visit to the related Institutions, Government and Non Government as follows:**

1. Welcoming by Deputy of Training and Development, BKKBN;  
The opening program was addressed by Ms. Kasmiyati, Deputy Training and Development, BKKBN. In her welcome address, Ms. Kasmiyati cited that Indonesia as a country with big number of population as Bangladesh in the international forum there is a tremendous effort to bring family planning become the mainstream of development. She explained that the Family Planning Program in Indonesia is not only about fertility control, but it is directed to create a small, happy and prosperous family. In addition, the Family Planning program approach in Indonesia is not only through health system, but also through cultural, community/social and religious approach. Ms. Kasmiyati emphasized that since 1980, the Government of Indonesia and Bangladesh has long been a good outstanding in the collaborating the capacity in the domain of family planning.

She also mentioned that family planning adopted become the national program by government since early 70's, then family planning program has been effectively met demographic and normative objective. The tremendous achievements are contributed significantly by Religious leaders and Faith Based institutions roles particularly from Muslims. The Ulamas, religious leaders and institutions get involved directly to family planning from the beginning.

2. Overview of Family Planning and Reproductive Health in Indonesia: Issues, policy, Program Management, by Director for International Training and Collaboration;

Eddy Hasmi, Director of International Training and Collaboration, mentioned that Indonesia which consists of more than 17,000 islands with population density of 1.9 million per square kilometers, from total population 230 million, makes the Family Planning program in Indonesia focused on managing population growth (Balanced Population Growth (BPG), improving the quality of the people, and fulfilling the reproductive rights of the couple and individuals.

Mr. Hasmi said that the success story was indicated by demographic indicators 1970-2007 such as the fertility rate has declined from 5.6 in early 1970 to 2.4 currently, CPR modern method increased from less than 10 percent to 57 percent during the same period of time, and age of marriage of women increased from 16 to 19.9 years. The key success factors among others are (1) Philosophy of the program, targeting on the shifting the values of society; (2) the program approach (cultural and religious); (3) essential background (political and commitment support from the highest decision makers and prominent leaders); and (4) solid management and leadership.

He also explained that the current vision of BKKBN is: All Families participate in Family Planning Program, while the Mission is: "To create a small, happy and prosperous family". Meanwhile the program strategies in meeting the current and the future challenge are: to encourage and empower the whole community in the Family Planning program; to rearrange the Family Planning program management; to improve the Family Planning program human resources; to improve the family resilience and prosperity through Family Planning services; and to improve Family Planning Financing System.

3. The Role of Muslim Leaders and Faith Based Organization in Family Planning Program in Indonesia, by Director of Family Prosperous and Resilience and Representative of Indonesia Council of Ulama;

Drs. H. Furqan Ia Faried, MA explained that the Role of Ulama in Islamic Community is stated in Guidance for Islamic life, such as a teacher for Islamic teaching, model in Islamic life style, giving religious opinion and guidance for all life phenomenon, non-formal leaders for Muslim community's activities and ceremonies, and as references for all Muslim community problems.

He mentioned that the Roles of Ulama in Family Planning in Indonesia are reflected in (1) formulating the Fatwa (Ulama's Decree) on Family Planning, (2) giving guidance on implementation of Family Planning program, (3) involving in advocacy and campaign activities on Family Planning program as a references of the Islamic community related to Family Planning program, (4)

providing Family Planning services (Family Planning service points) in their Islamic institution, (5) conducting training program on various issues related Family Planning program especially advocacy and IEC program, and (6) Developing & producing book, booklet, leaflet, and other IEC materials and media, Islamic forum for Family Planning IEC program such as: Friday sermon (Khutbah Jum'at); Pre Marriage counseling in KUA (Sub District Ministry of Religious Affairs Office), Wedding party, Islamic community learning program (Majlis Ta'lim), Islamic education centers, and special Islamic community gathering.

The strategy to strengthen the role of Ulama in family planning program has been developed by BKKBN, among others are (1) regular meeting (dialogue) with ulama, (2) inviting the Ulama in various Family Planning seminars and workshops, Traveling seminars, comparative studies, and study tours in country and abroad, (3) involving the Ulama in developing Family Planning IEC materials, books, media etc, and (4) inviting the Ulama in National Family day and other ceremonies related Family Planning program.

Fruitful result is most of Ulama accept the Family Planning program, Ulama actively involved in various Family Planning advocacy, IEC activities, various books, leaflet (IEC materials) related Family Planning program in Islamic view are developed and distributed to grass root levels and accepted by the Ummat; Increasing various Family Planning program activities and services in the Islamic institutions; and Increasing numbers of Muslim community accept Family Planning concept and become Family Planning acceptors.

#### **While the field visit as follows:**

#### **4. Nahdatul Ulama (NU) Views and Activities in Family Planning Program**

Dr. Sururin & Dr. Wan Nendra from PBNU explained that Central Board of Fatayat NU in particular and the NU organization in general extremely supported the implementation of Family Planning program and Reproductive Health. In order to develop its members, through UNFPA's support, currently there are several activities has been conducted, among others are Seminar and Launching of RH Education materials for Pre-marital couple. The Central Board of Fatayat also emphasize to their ummat the need to increase awareness towards health for their family, for instance on arrangement and planning of child number, on implementing Family Planning as well. He added that health matters including planning the family are the basic aspect of life. Therefore they need to manage the family. The Nahdatul Ulama also provides family planning/contraceptive services through their health clinics across the country.

5. Government policy to increase the participation of Muslim leaders and Faith based organization in the National Development, by The Secretary General of Ministry of Religious Affairs;

Drs. H. Muzakir, MM, Secretary of Director General of Islamic Community Guidance in Ministry of Religious Affairs explained that in supporting Family Planning program, Ministry of Religious Affairs has a program called Sakinah Family (Happy and Prosperous Family). Sakinah family means a family built on legal marriage basic resulting peaceful, happy and loyal couple with their good children and surroundings which is full of love so that, with this condition, will create a happy, peaceful and healthy family.

He emphasized the Regulation of Minister of Religious Affairs No. 3 year 2006, about main duty of Directorate General of Islamic Community Guidance is formulating and implementing the policy agreed on by Minister of Religious Affairs. Furthermore, he said that Ministry of Religious Affairs implemented the guidance for Moslem Family in Indonesia. This task has implemented through the office of religious affairs (KUA) at the sub-district level. There are 5035 KUAs in Indonesia. The tasks of KUA among others are to register the marriage among the Muslim and marriage counseling.

Drs. H. Muzakir explained that according to Fatwa (Ulama's Decree) of Indonesia Council of Ulama in 1983, Family Planning as an effort and attempt to regulate pregnancy within family which is not opposite with religious law, State Ideology (Pancasila) and State Regulation. The Sakinah Family, which love each others.(mawaddah wa rohmah, is needed to reach the health, smart and religious generation. In the effort of reaching Peaceful Family, before having a ceremony and register the marriage, a couple be given a counseling on how to manage a family and the importance of Family Planning. This counseling is given in collaboration with civil organization and faith based organization such as: Nahdatul Ulama, Muhammadiyah, Family Welfare Movement (PKK).

The Ministry of Religious Affairs divided Sakinah Family into five phases: Pre Sakinah, Sakinah I, Sakinah II, Sakinah III dan Sakinah III+. Each of these phases has specific criteria. Ministry of Religious Affairs emphasized that the role of Ulamas is tremendously important to make Family Planning successful. In the early implementation, there was a pros and cons on family planning matters from Islamic teachings in Indonesia. It needs to be solved. The issue debated in Islamic Doctrine regarding Family Planning is in deciding the number of child. In this case, the role of Ulamas is extremely urgent to be able to convince the society. Lately, Ministry of Religious Affairs in collaboration with BKKBN, Indonesian Ulama Council (MUI), Nahdatul Ulama, Muhammadiyah, and Indonesia Council of Mosque compiled a guide book of KIE for religious elucidator entitled "Membangun Keluarga Sehat dan Sakinah" (To Build A Health and Sakinah Family) issued in 2007.

6. Muhammadiyah's Policy Towards Family Planning: Programs and activities, by Representatives of Muhammadiyah;

Muhammadiyah is a strong partner of BKKBN to realize a small, happy and prosperous family, said Dr. Sudibyo Markus. Basically, the program of Muhammadiyah is relevant with the program of BKKBN which besides supporting Family Planning program, having Sakinah Family as well. Since it was established in 1912, Muhammadiyah focused on program amar ma'ruf nahi munkar (Telling to do good work and avoiding to do bad work). Dr. Markus underlined that from learning Surat Al Ma'un, can be developed society based activities program, such as: education, health services, Majelis Tarjih, Muhammadiyah Student Association, Aisyiyah and Nasyatul Aisyah.

Furthermore, Dr. Markus stated that in collaboration with Muhammadiyah and BKKBN, Muhammadiyah holds on "Amar Ma'ruf Nahi Munkar" so that Muhammadiyah is able to coordinate with Family Planning program. During this time, BKKBN always invites Muhammadiyah in arranging Family Planning program.

7. The policy of MUI (Indonesia Council of Ulama in Family Planning Program: program and activities have been done, dialogue with MUI representatives;

The main consideration of why MUI have an important role in Family Planning program, delivered by Prof. Dr. Yunahan Ilyas, MA is that MUI is established in the aim of creating a qualified society (Khaira Ummah), safe, peaceful and prosperous whether spiritually and physically given by Allah SWT (baldatun thayyibatun wa rabbun ghafur). To reach that aim, MUI have several efforts among others, to make guide and counseling, basic policy in dakwah, to create relationship model among religions, to build relationship and coordination among faith based organizations with other institutions.

Mr. H. Amidhan, Chair of MUI added that MUI holds on Al Qur'an and Prophet Hadist giving stressing and cues that Moslem has to be a qualified society, the best society who has superiority. Similarly with the message above, Moslem has to strive to build and be queath a better quality of life to the next generation. Therefore, a wide range of efforts to enhance the quality initiated from quality of family needed to be developed. In this case, the role of MUI in taking a part to build the quality of society and nation. Therefore, MUI and BKKBN is relevant in realizing a qualified and peaceful family. MUI has also issued fatwa (Ulama's Decree) in the Ulama National Meeting concerning on population, health and building in 1983 where Family Planning is allowed in the meaning of tanzim al-nasl, but it remains taking a note of the kind and method that contraception tool is used for Family Planning.

8. Observation and dialogue on the role of Al-Azhar Islamic school in implementing Adolescent Reproductive Health program, by the Al-Azhar Islamic School Team, South Jakarta;

Vice Headquarters of Al Azhar Senior High School 1, Dr. Zahruddin, informed that the curriculum in Al Azhar is applied in line with the Islamic Corridor and Doctrine. In the relation with reproductive health, the material was delivered through Biology subject in the class 11 and 12, because it has benefit for all students and Islamic Society. The material on Family Planning was inserted in the subject of Munakahat. Beside that, the institution (school) also conducted premarital counseling to enhance the student's insight and behavior concerning with reproductive health.

All aspects above are aimed in order that all students are able to take care of themselves, to take care of their reproductive organs from any bacteria and virus including HIV which is coming from drug and food, and also after their graduation, so they are able to support Family Planning program. The Board of school also encouraged students to promote the ARH issues in their extra curriculum activities. It can be done through writing essay in school magazine, song or drama activities, or peer educator program.

9. Observation and dialogue on the role of Islamic Boarding School to Family Planning/Reproductive Health and the role of school in implementing Adolescent Reproductive Health Program at Madrasah Aliyah of Darun Najah Boarding School, the Team.

KH. Mahrus Amin, one of the founders of Darun Najah Islamic Boarding School, stated that this boarding school is not only learning about religion but also science. In this case, the students are taught the peacefulness regarding to the *Fiqh Bidayatul Mujtahid* which learns about the free in choosing *madzhab*. Furthermore, he said that it's emphasize to the way of think which is not narrow so that even though family planning program is still become uncertain thing, it's proper to sustain with the fundamental of *dalil naqli* in order that it will not inherit a weak generation referring to the reason of more children more risk. In addition, one of the delegation members of Bangladesh, Mr. Mohammed Muhibula Hil Baqee, suggests that the meaning of weak generation in not only refers to the physically weak but also from the faith side.

Meanwhile, K. H. Mahrus Amin explains that the reproduction health education in that boarding school is taught by the *munakahat* lesson in 11<sup>th</sup> grade and particularly from woman students are given an additional lesson through *nisaiyah* lesson.

10. Meeting with Indonesian Muslim Scholar on the Role of Islamic Muslim Leaders Scholar of Family Planning Program; by Prof. Andi Faisal Bakti, Ph.D, from State Islamic University (UIN).

The vision of UIN Syarif Hidayatullah is to become a prominent higher learning institution, nationally and internationally that integrates sciences, Islamic teaching, humanities and Indonesian views, emphasizing in Islamic values and integration Islamic value mid science, as noted by UIN Vice Head University, Prof. Dr. Andy Faisal Bakti. Then, he stated that Islam accepts family planning program because the prophet Muhammad SAW never forbids the *coitus interruptus* and so do the five *mazhabs* except Maliki and Hambali.

Furthermore, he explains that in UIN Syarif Hidayatullah, the study of family planning included into *fiqh* and *munakahat* curriculum by regarding to the *dalil naqli* so that it will not inherit the weak generation in understanding of weak education, weak economic and weak welfare. In the *munakahat* discussion also talks about the element of family planning. The term of woman is like a farm has to be related by the time of breast feeding as two years concerning to the space time of pregnancy.

11. Discussion and observation on the Family planning services provided by Jakarta Islamic Hospital, by the Team of Medical Doctors and Paramedics.

Dr. H. Prastowo explained that the Islamic Hospital of Jakarta (RSIJ) has a unit of Mother and Child Health Care Program. This unit provides the home care program, where, if necessary, the paramedics can be assigned to visit the patients in their home for antenatal and postnatal care. This hospital also complied with government regulation and policy to waive the charge of the maternal and child health care for the poor family. In this hospital, issues related to reproductive health/family planning is treated in line with the Islamic Corridor and Doctrine. For example, the abortion is handled with the counseling first before taking the action and the patient can choose whether the woman doctor or nurse who exams her. The hospital also provides the religious services by Muballighs to the patients.

12. Discussion on the Book of Muslim Leaders on FP/RH, with several Resource Persons in Bandung, West Java.

During the OST, BKKBN facilitate participants to meet with the writer team of IEC book of Population, Reproductive Health/Family Planning and Gender from Islamic Views. This IEC materials book developed by the inter countries team from Indonesia, Bangladesh, and Iran. The initiative to developed this IEC material book is supported by UNFPA Indonesia, Iran, and Bangladesh. This purpose of this meeting is to enrich the content of the book.

The discussion was very fruitful. The discussion talks about the five substances which are family planning in Islam, gender in Islam, maternal and child health, adolescents reproductive health, HIV/AIDS and Islamic

perspective. In this case, The Bangladesh delegation suggests: 1) Every quotation should be attaching the sources; 2) the hadist attachment should be attaching the writer; 3) the *dhoif* hadist should be deleted; 4) should be attaching dalil naqli which more appropriate. The delegation from Bangladesh suggests deleting several words, sentences and paragraphs which are not appropriate along with adding the sub heading and the resume should be more comprehensive and communicative. The writer team agreed to accommodate many suggestions made by the delegation from Bangladesh. They will conduct further meeting to finalize the book. The publishing would be shared with the Bangladesh delegation.
